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1. Important Safety Information

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Important safety information.

The following information and precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of damage, fire, electric shock or injury to people. If in any doubt about installation, operation or maintenance please contact your vendor or Ashton Bentley.

- Follow all warnings and instructions in this document and marked on the equipment.
- · Allow plenty of space in the construction area.
- Never operate the system outdoors or in very humid conditions, or allow ingress of any liquid.
- Always use suitable cable management or install under a raised floor to avoid trip hazards.
- Do not block or cover any ventilation vents in the products.

Displays, Chassis and Tables.

• As some parts are large and heavy, we recommend two people assemble.

Electrical.

If the incoming mains electrical feed is unstable or prone to transient input voltage spikes more than 1KV, we recommend the use of a surge protector connected to the power input cable.

Pay close attention to the product when it is turned on. If any of the following are noticed, then do not use the product until everything is back to a fully safe state:

- Power cables, plugs, power supplies/adapters, extension cords, surge protectors that are cracked, broken, or damaged.
- · Signs of overheating, smoke, sparks, or fire.
- Signs of liquid ingress or an object has fallen onto the electronic elements of product, the power cable, or power supply/adapter.

Note: If you notice these conditions with a product that is not supplied by Ashton Bentley, disconnect from the Ashton Bentley product, and stop using that product until you can contact the product manufacturer for further instructions, or until you get a suitable replacement.

Never wrap a power cable around a power supply/adapter or other object. Always route power cables so that they will not be walked on, tripped over, or pinched by objects.

Do not use any power supply/adapter that shows corrosion at the ac input pins or shows signs of overheating (such as deformed plastic).

The power cable and supply/adapter provided with this product are intended to be used with this product only. Do not use them with any other products. The use of 3rd party power supplies/adaptors will invalidate the warranty.

Do not use your system, or disconnect any cables or perform installation, maintenance, or reconfiguration of this product during an electrical storm.

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Overview.

The Videobar/Camera Mounts comprise 3 Kits that have different heights, plus an Expansion Bracket for some of the larger Video Bars.

Depending on the fixing points of the Videobar or Camera the bracket that holds them can be fixed vertically or horizontally.

Kit VM1

For majority of Video Bars and Cameras to mount on our 43, 55-65 and 75 Floor-to-Wall Chassis.

Kit VM2

For majority of Video Bars and Cameras to mount on our Large Universal Chassis (86" displays).

Kit VM3

For majority of Video Bars and Cameras to mount on our Large Universal Chassis 98" displays).

Kit VM4

For majority of Video Bars and Cameras to mount on our Large Universal Chassis 98" displays).

2. Product Components

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
Product Components.

Each box will have a label attached that identifies what it contains, plus some additional information. Some labels have more details than others depending on contents.

A sample label looks like this:


The following pages have a number of instruction panels detailing each step of assembly. Please follow them in the sequence shown.
